# Early 2020 Covid and on-going

- Pre-existing lack of houses
- Baseline poverty & deprivation
- Loss of tourism (international & domestic)
- Hospitality & retail = economic impacts
- Rental prices = housing distress
- Homelessness & parks/CBD issues



# **Government response**

### Early 2020 Covid

- MSD emergency grants:
  - A person is entitled to up to 3 weeks accommodation
  - Relationship between the 'guest' and the motellier (MSD pays a grant but is otherwise not involved)
- Accommodation providers pivoted:
  - Started advertising for MSD clients



# Impacts on our community

Concentration in Fenton, CBD and Tarewa Rd

Crime and social issues in the public eye – safety perceptions
On-going Covid lockdowns / impacts

- Economy / social Complaints in local and national media led to significant reputation damage

Un-managed placements put children and families into unsuitable venues



# **RLC's response**

Mayor repeatedly raised concern with PM, Min Woods and Min Sepoloni

Maintain longerterm focus – plan changes, infrastructure & house builds

EH Taskforce (supported by Ministers) – contracted motels for children & hub

RLC approaches to accommodation providers - fire safety, BWoF & 7 high priority



# **Next steps**

### **RMA & building Act**

- Council requirements 'safe and appropriate'
- Risk based / time & resource requirement e.g. 12 at a time
- Assume change of use /activity

### **Considers**

- Need for sufficient supply of EH
- 13 motels in consent process
- Time to consent & make building changes
- Allows provider choice
