Community Safety is a term that describes how well protected people feel about the consequences of real or perceived risks.


Primarily relates to crime and safety issues that may result in harm or fear of harm occurring:

- in homes, neighbourhoods, at work and within commercial and public spaces including on roads
- when connecting with others in person, by phone and online
- during emergencies and natural disaster

- The campaign must be underpinned by a positive shift in attitudes and behavior throughout our community.

- Campaign elements in Te Reo Māori and English.
- There is an over-arching campaign for community safety, and will be leveraged for communications around bylaw engagement.
- Campaign is digitally driven and will utilise RLC channels/assets supported by a small marketing budget.

PERCEPTIONS OF SAFETY

Inner City feedback - Rotorua Safety & Wellbeing Survey commenced 7 Dec 2022

Our commitment to making Rotorua a safer place:

- More visible Police (on foot, bike, vehicle patrols) in the Inner City, urban shopping centres and public spaces
- Integrated deployment of Police, Guardians, regulatory staff and security partners
- 3. Strategically located and improved compliance signage for alcohol ban areas and no dogs.
- 4. Public education and Community Safety awareness initiatives



SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS IMPROVE REPUTATION & SAFETY IN INNER CITY

- Improved presence of Police, Guardians and Maori Wardens
- Shared intelligence to inform efficient and effective deployment and response
- Integrated deployment of Police, Guardians, Maori Wardens and Security in key locations
- Extended CCTV network
- Improved reporting and response to crime, anti-social behaviour/signal crime
- Co-ordinated information and support for businesses
- Positive community activations
