PURPOSE

PROCESS

- Amount available assigned by formula Total RLC: \$32.19m
 - Tranche 1 \$8.05m Sept '22
 - Tranche 2 \$24.15m July '24
- Process
 - Draft Funding Proposal to be submitted by 30th September 2022
 - Only 1 application can be made
 - · Assessed by the Department of Internal Affairs vs. criteria
 - · Outcome notified within 6 weeks
 - 7 years to use the funds, only cleared upon receipt of actual expenses

Note: Participation in the scheme does not oblige council to publicly support the Three Waters reform or prevent them from speaking out against it



FUND ELIGIBILITY AND PRIORITISATION CRITERIA

- 1. Eligibility:
- New projects and/or accelerate, scale-up and/or enhancement of existing
- 5 year or less duration of expenditure
- Supports the three waters service delivery reform objectives
- · AND other local wellbeing outcomes
- AND aligns with the priorities of central and local government:
 - transition to a sustainable and lowemissions economy
 - enable housing development and growth
 - support local place-making and improvements in community well-being.



- 2. Prioritisation
- I. Value for money
- II. Strategic plans in place
- III. Has Iwi / Māori support
- IV. Delivery risk is low
- V. Community support



RLC SELECTION CRITERIA

5 pass/fail criteria based on RLC priorities and fund criteria for basic eligibility:

- 1. Finish what we started: Prioritise in-flight projects developing funding deficits
- 2. Construction ready: Projects that have business plans in place
- 3. Prioritise baseline outcomes: Concentrate on at risk 'baseline' (i.e. in-flight or existing commitments)
- 4. Will not be transferred: Avoid investing in assets that will be transferred away as part of Three Waters programme
- 5. Aligned with the 3 purposes for the Fund: Avoid wasting time and resources evaluating projects that are ineligible
- > If all 'pass' then move to prioritise based on remaining fund criteria
