NATIONAL POLICY STATEMENTS AND NEW ZEALAND COASTAL POLICY STATEMENT

National policy statements and New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement

National policy statements (NPSs) and the New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement (NZCPS) form part of the Resource Management Act's policy framework and are prepared by central government. NPSs and the NZCPS contain objectives, polices and methods that must be given effect to by policy statements and plans. NPSs and the NZCPS must also be given regard to by consent authorities when making decisions on resource consent applications, alongside other considerations.

The following table provides an overview of whether any relevant review of the Rotorua District Plan has been undertaken in relation to NPSs and the NZCPS.

Relevant provisions include strategic objectives and policies for renewable electricity and special rules for the hydro dam electricity generation core sites.
New Zealand Coastal Policy Statement 2010	This national policy statement does not apply to the Rotorua District Plan.
National Policy Statement on Electricity Transmission 2008	This formed part of the legislative background when the current Rotorua District Plan was reviewed.

If an activity doesn't comply with an NES, it is likely to require a resource consent. NESs must be observed and enforced by local authorities.
