Community Funding Investment Policy

Policy Purpose:

- To guide RLC in the allocation of community funding, to communities, groups and organisations within the Rotorua District.
- The policy supports community alignment and contribution towards Council outcomes and priorities as well as the needs of communities and neighbourhoods to be safe, thriving and resilient
- Provides guidelines around:
 - Application process
 - Eligibility
 - Allocation and management of Council's community funding



Current Investment Framework



Neighbourhood Matching Fund

Match volunteer contribution Small grants under \$5k Large Grants under \$20k Total fund = \$120k 46 recipients over 3 years



Community Grants

3 yr secured funding \$1k-\$5k Total fund = \$105k 44 Recipients



Partnership Agreements 3yr secured funding \$5k-\$40k Total fund = \$210k 15 Recipients


Highlights

- Community and Council alignment Tatau Tatau
- Estimated volume of reach to >20,000 community members per year
- Sustainable funding practice amongst funders: RLC, Rotorua Trust, Bay Trust, Dept. of Internal Affairs and Geyser Community Foundation
- In 2023/2024 alone the Neighbourhood Matching Fund leveraged \$437,444 worth of volunteer contribution towards community activities, a 264% return on investment
- Community sector deliver a more holistic and preventative approach to safety, rather than safety enforcement



Why Is This Policy Review Happening Now?

- Policy review is underway
- Draft Long Term Plan is open
- Run in parallel as one relies on the other
- Funding level adjustments has implications for community



Proposed Changes Based on Feedback

- Policy name change to Community Funding Policy
- Review reporting process to reflect community impact
- Neighbourhood Matching Fund name changed to Community Matching Fund
- Amend Neighbourhood Matching Fund food allowance from \$200 to \$500



Proposed Changes Continued...

Inclusion of:

- Council's proposed 9 key priorities, to replace Council's 2030 goals
- Scope
- Social Enterprises in *Eligible Applicants*
- Funding panel representation, conflicts of interest disclosure, intellectual property of applicants

New exclusions:

- Te Rākau Tū Pakari fund
- Building or resource consents or development contributions
- Purchase of vehicles or alcohol
- Travel and accommodation
- Any cost associated with fundraising
