I feel extremely unsafe in Rotorua particularly in the city centre and around Fenton Street and areas of Glenholme. I have been in town with my children and witnessed a couple verbally abusing each other shouting and screaming with foul language at each other. I have had a person scream and swear at me as I walked past in town. I have been with my children about to go into the library and witnessed a group of young people start fighting violently, we were so frightened we stayed in the car and drove away. I am afraid when I stop at the lights on Fenton Street and always have my doors locked when driving. I have seen numerous times people walking along Fenton Street shouting and stumbling along the street obviously under the influence of drugs or alcohol. There is rubbish all over Fenton Street and the motels do nothing to keep the place looking nice despite being paid extremely well for having emergency housing at their motels. I do not allow my teenage daughter to go into town with her friends as we have seen too many people with anti-social and intimidating behaviour hanging around. I have friends who will not come to Rotorua anymore to holiday as they have felt threatened here and can see how it is not a desirable place to holiday. I feel embarrassed by my town, every single time I venture out I witness some sort antisocial behaviour.

With the influx of these people the police have so much work they are not addressing all crimes that are committed with poor resources, making me and my family feel even less safe. Our health services are already dangerously overloaded, we do not have the resources to care appropriately for the influx of those needing the services doing the locals a disservice as well as the imports who are housed here from out of town.

I am OPPOSED to the granting of Resource Consent to enable the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development to use the sites and existing buildings of 12 motels in Rotorua for Emergency Housing for the next five years.

Rotorua has long been known as a premium tourist destination.

If Resource Consent is granted for these 12 motels, Rotorua will continue to be known as **New Zealand's homeless destination.**

The Rotorua Lakes Council and Mayor are claiming they are trying to restore Rotorua's reputation which as everyone knows has been seriously damaged by the use of many of its motels for emergency housing since March 2020.

Well that would appear not to be the case.

To think the Government would consider it a good idea to continue with emergency housing in central Rotorua for the foreseeable future is nothing short of nonsensical.

Why is our Council standing by and letting this happen?

What is there in it for Rotorua when many of these 'homeless' people aren't originally from Rotorua?

Why is Rotorua expected to shoulder so much of New Zealand's homeless burden?

We can only wonder what incentives may have been offered by central government to Rotorua Lakes Council.

The use of motels provides a quick fix for central government at the expense of Rotorua.

In the intervening time since March 2020, suitable accommodation could have been built for the homeless which is not in the centre of Rotorua's tourist accommodation and it would have been more suitable than motel accommodation.

The long suffering residents of Rotorua would like their city as they knew it back.

The suburb of Glenholme has undergone a dramatic change as a result of the emergency accommodation in their area.

Glenholme used to be a suburb that was hard to buy into. When places came on the market they were in high demand.

Not any more.

The crime statistics throughout Rotorua as viewed on the Neighbourhood Support burglary incident list circulated each week generally contain a high proportion of crime committed in Glenholme and central Rotorua.

Countdown Fenton Street and its staff are having to contend with not 'drive offs' but 'walk offs' where people are just walking straight out the front door past staff and security guards without paying, wheeling trolleys laden with goods.

Many of us are not comfortable any more in the CBD, we drive through Rotorua with our car doors locked, our library has apparently found the need to have a minimum of two full time security guards who incidentally wear bullet proof vests and in fact security guards are visible throughout Rotorua on a full time basis.

The local police are stretched to cope with the rise in crime over the last two years.

And the Government and Council want to embed this situation into central Rotorua for the next FIVE YEARS!

The businesses and residents of Rotorua deserve better from their Council and from the government.

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'Staged approach' to motel use slammed

Lobby groups say Government should not flout law over homeless



he Government says it has no immediate plans to apply for resource consent so three Fenton St motels housing 170 homeless people comply with the district plan.

A resident lobby group says the Government should not be allowed to flout the law.

Tuscany Villas, Emerald Spa and Four Canoes have been housing the city's most vulnerable since Rotorna went into the first Covid-19 lockdown

All three motels are contracted by the Ministry of Housing and Urban development to offer accommodation to those in need

But like all motels offering accommodation for the homeless, it is against the district plan because motels are only consented to offer visitor accommodation on a short-

The council has taken steps to enforce the plan by making motel operators apply for resource consent to operate emergency housing

The ministry has just applied for resource consent for 12 motels it contracts but hasn't included the three motels in its application process because it says it's focusing on the others.

The Rotoma Lakes Council is taking a tough stauce with about 40 other motels that aren't contracted by the Government that are also operas emergency housing providers by threatening court action if they don't become compliant.

However, the council says it hasn't written to the owners of Froerald Spa, Tuscany Villas and Four Canoes because it is taking a "staged" approach.

Four Canoes is contracted to Te Taumata o Ngati Whakaue lho Ake Trust and can cater for up to 182 people but on May 31 had 52 people. Emerald Spa can take up to 99 people but had 65 occupants at the end of last month and Tuscany Villas can have up to 69 people and had 53 people at the end of last month. The latter two are contracted to Visions of a Helping Hand.

Restore Rotorua chakman Trevor Newbrook said the motels had housed homeless people for two years and in his view, the council should make the ministry apply for consent or stop operating them.

In his view: To suggest the council

is taking a staged approach is not acceptable, after over two years."

Newbrook said the generosity of local had people been exhausted

He said "the Government is not above the law and he believed the housing minister needed to explain why these motels were being used outside the district plan.

Rotorua mayorai can-Fletcher Tabuteau said, in his view, it did not make sense for the ministry to not include the three motels.

Tahuteau launched a petition to Parliament calling for emergency housing in Rotonua for non-Rotonia residents to be banned, alternative solutions to motels in Fenton St and resources for police and the council to improve the safety of residents.

He said it was about 'malting a noise" so the Government was forced look for better solutions.

Ministry housing and services delivery general Jonathan manager Fraser said the council and the ministry had focused on prioritising the consent applications for the 12 motels in the first instance"

But we appreciate further discussion about another three motels we

engaged to house people as part of the Covid-19 lockdown response may need to happen."

He said the ministry was in regular discussion with the council over concerns about how the motel accommodation was delivered so it could operate within the district plan.

We're also focused on ensuring that people requiring emergency housing are supported with the appropriate wraparound support that brings stability to families, and in particular vulnerable children and rangitable as we work with the council, Käinga Ora and others to continue to increase the supply of affordable homes in Rotorua.

Government's Covid-19 response to help vulnerable people who could not be safely isolated.

He said the motels operated like other ministry motels and transitional housing where received social people support and were contracted housing to providers

Council district development deputy chief executive Jean-Paul Gaston said the council was taking a staged approach to ensuring compliance".

The council was dealing with the 12 ministry applications first.

Minister Housing Megan Woods sald the Government was working closely with the council to ensure emergency and transitional housing operated within the district plan, and backed the council's staged approach to compliance. She said the three



Lobby groups say Government should not flout law over homeless



he Government says it has no immediate plans to apply for resource consent so three Fenton St motels housing 170 homeless people comply with the district plan.

A resident lobby group says the Government should not be allowed to flout the law.

Tuscany Villas, Emerald Spa and Four Canoes have been housing the city's most vulnerable since Rotorna went into the first Covid-19 lockdown

All three motels are contracted by the Ministry of Housing and Urban development to offer accommodation to those in need

But like all motels offering accommodation for the homeless, it is against the district plan because motels are only consented to offer visitor accommodation on a short-

The council has taken steps to enforce the plan by making motel operators apply for resource consent to operate emergency housing

The ministry has just applied for resource consent for 12 motels it contracts but hasn't included the three motels in its application process because it says it's focusing on the others.

The Rotoma Lakes Council is taking a tough stauce with about 40 other motels that aren't contracted by the Government that are also operas emergency housing providers by threatening court action if they don't become compliant,

However, the council says it hasn't written to the owners of Froerald Spa, Tuscany VIIIas and Four Canoes because it is taking a "staged" approach.

Four Canoes is contracted to Te Taumata o Ngati Whakaue Iho Ake Trust and can cater for up to 182 people but on May 31 had 52 people. Emerald Spa can take up to 99 people but had 65 occupants at the end of last month and Tuscany Villas can have up to 69 people and had 53 people at the end of last month. The latter two are contracted to Visions of a Helping Hand.

Restore Rotorua chakman Trevor Newbrook said the motels had housed homeless people for two years and in his view, the council should make the ministry apply for consent or stop operating them.

In his view: To suggest the council

is taking a staged approach is not acceptable, after over two years."

Newbrook said the generosity of local bad people been exhausted

He said "the Government is not above the law and he believed the housing minister needed to explain why these motels were being used outside the district plan.

Rotorua mayorai can-Fletcher Tabuteau said, in his view, it did not make sense for the ministry to not include the three motels.

Tahuteau launched a petition to Parliament calling for emergency housing in Rotonua for non-Rotonia residents to be banned, alternative solutions to motels in Fenton St and resources for police and the council to improve the safety of residents.

He said it was about 'making a noise" so the Government was forced look for better solutions.

Ministry housing and services delivery general Jonathan manager Fraser said the council and the ministry had focused on prioritising the consent applications for the 12 motels in the first instance"

But we appreciate further discussion about another three motels we

engaged to house people as part of the Covid-19 lockdown response may need to happen."

He said the ministry was in regular discussion with the council over concerns about how the motel accommodation was delivered so it could operate within the district plan.

We're also focused on ensuring that people requiring emergency housing are supported with the appropriate wraparound support that brings stability to families, and in particular vulnerable children and rangitable as we work with the council, Käinga Ora and others to continue to increase the supply of affordable homes in Rotorua.

He said the three motels were brought on board as part of the



istry motels and transitional housing where received social people support and were contracted housing to providers Council district develop-

ment deputy chief executive Jean-Paul Gaston said the council was taking a staged approach to ensuring compliance".

The council was dealing with the 12 ministry applications first.

I personally have seen behaviour I have never seen here before from my office in town just off Fenton street. We have fights weekly on the street outside. Loud domestic fights more than once a week and even had someone urinate on our front door while we were at work (all female work force). There has been theft during the day is becoming more brazen as there appears to be no consequences. A car was broken into at 11.50am on a Friday around the corner on a busy road last week while the owner left it parked and locked for 5 minutes. It was motel residents that did this. The girls I work with dont feel safe to walk from work to parked cars

This has been better as the weather has got colder but when its warm there are grouph drinking, smoking and swearing on many corners. Sometimes harmlessly and sometimes with agression to passerbys

Many International tourist walk the streets of Rotorua at night after a meal or sightseeing. As they return, we will see the results of large concentrations of less that desirable behaviours that will impact visitors.

We have always had homeless in Rotorua with the warm ground in winter and we have had emergency housing but

Having people living in motels is not good for their mental health, their overall health and the sense of belonging. Many people living in the motels are not from Rotorua so therefore have no link to the community and no whanau/family support.

Using all the motels for emergency housing prevents tourists (both international and national) from coming to stay and play in Rotorua. This means that any money is not being brought to the city and all the tourist business are struggling and/or going broke. This also means that Rotorua is not going to be known as a tourist destination but as a place for emergency housing.

With no link/contact to the area, the people coming are likely not to care about the area so anti-social behaviour (such as crime, drug use, shop lifting, people being sworn at, etc), is likely to increase.

Motels are not a place for children to stay long term because there is no place for them to play. Also with them moving from school to school is disruptive to teachers, classes, the children and the family. This is not good for them because it has been proven that a good education is a way for a child/ren to get out of the poverty trap and succeed in life

Emergency housing needs only to be a short-term, stop-gap measure not permanent and having twelve more motels being used for this for a minimum of 5 years (because it could be extended) doesn't appear to be a short-term measure.

Motels aren't designed for people to stay in long term. The facilities are not sufficient, therefore is not enough space in the room to stay longterm; there is not enough space to exercise, to cook healthy meals, to wash/dry clothes.

A motel is not a house, therefore people living in them don't have the respect/mana gained from owning/renting a property. Therefore the motels are damaged, etc and this will cause ongoing costs to the motel owners and the government having to pay for constant repairs.

The housing crisis is real and housing costs/rental costs are not affordable but putting people/families into motels is not the answer. Having tourists staying in motels spending money and growing the community/region/country is.

Moving people from one area (where they have support from friends and family) to an area (where they have none) is not the answer either. Keeping people with friends and family means that people having the support needed to: a) find a job and b) keep the job means that these people can contribute to society and potentially help themselves to get out of the poverty trap and help grow the community/region/country.

The negative social impacts on Rotorua are already being felt. Crime is increasing. People feel unsafe in the area. Would anyone want to walk around the area alone at night - no! For many years I would let my wife or children walk around Glenholme safely at night, not now. As an adult male I avoid being out after dark. I have been approached in the supermarket carparks on numerous occassions, abused and felt intmidated. We do not feel safe in our home. It is pretty much a wait until we get burgled scenario.

Local businesses are feeling the impact as they are having to prevent anti-social behaviour. These businesses are needing to spend money on extra security featueres, not required before our hotels and motels were used for contracted emergency housing. These businesses, who are run by hard working citizens will surely close.

When we require the accomodation for visitors to town they are either not going to be able to get accomodation or have to share with contracted emergency housing tennants, many of whom are anti-social and dangerous with addiction and mental helath issues.

The stigma attached to contracted emergency housing such as this will have long lasting impacts on our city. It will take generations to recover from this short-sighted vision. People will not visit Rotorua, and this will have a damaging impact for a very long time. Already we have friends from out of Rotorua who often ask are we safe and "no they don't want to visit, as it is too dangerous."

Property values in the Glenholme, Fenton park and Victoria areas will be negatively impacted - this a guarantee. Should ratepayers be forced to pay twice to home tennants that are not locals? We pay our rates, we pay when our house valuation falls. Don't kid yourself that everyone in the motels and hotels are locals. When we bought our property in Glenholme it was in the knowledge that we knew what was in our area. We chose to live in Glenholme because it was safe. Contracted emergency housing along Fenton Street was not part of what we invested in. We would never have bought in Glenholme had we known that this council was going to allow this sort of housing in the area.

Five years is a long time, the area will no doubt become a ghetto in this time. There is no way our council should even entertain this idea. You are meant to look after us ratepayers. Can you imagine the scene that greets visitors, if they still come, in 4-5 years time. It is not hard to predict.

I oppose all of the above applications for the following reasons:

The high density of emergency/transitional housing in Rotorua has in my experience lead to exponential growth in many anti social behaviors and crime. On a typical drive to work along Fenton Street I will see not less than 2 police vehicles at various Motels. This is not what we signed up for as residents in this area. Our family have changed our behaviors as a direct result of the high congestion of this type of occupancy and we no longer walk along Fenton Street, are a lot more security conscious and in the last 18 months have called the police twice (previously we have not done this) due to anti social behavior drifting along Wylie Street. My daughter who is still at school witnessed a women being assaulted outside one of the emergency housing motels which for her was quite distressing, and even more distressing - no police in attendance with a motel full of people who would have been very aware of what was occurring.

I am concerned that pre-COVID we were viewed as a desirable tourist destination and as we try to re-build post COVID there are less and less accommodation options for tourists which over and above not having international tourists leads to a further decline in our tourist dollar, having an impact on business and subsequently employment. In addition to this it encourages landlords to utilise their properties as Air B n B further exacerbating the housing shortage. Rotorua's reputation is at stake as a tourist destination particularly with accommodation providers who have chosen to retain tourist being located amongst these high density hot spots where anti social behavior including clusters of people congregating and carrying themselves in an intimidating manner.

Not withstanding our beautiful entry into Rotorua has become an ugly stain with graffiti, shopping trollies and undesirable behavior on the streets. This ongoing situation will have an affect on Rotorua for generations to come. Rotorua's reputation is at stake as a tourist destination particularly with accommodation providers who have chosen to retain tourist being located amongst these high density hot spots where anti social behavior including clusters of people congregating and carrying themselves in an intimidating manner.

Motels are not a long term solution to accommodation and I would urge you to be influential by not endorsing high density, high concentration housing in motels. Latest data from MSD suggest that up to a third of occupants in these motels are not local which we absolutely do not support. According to RLC report 5 to 10 families are coming to Rotorua each week with family harm safety plans and they have no association to Rotorua.

Tamariki residing in these motels deserve more, they deserve better. We are on our way to having generations of "Motel Kids" which will take a lifetime to rectify. A step in the right direction is to not allow our City to be the Emergency Housing Hub of NZ and to work towards improved long term solutions.

What is the plan to reduce the numbers needing emergency housing motels in Rotorua? There is no guarantee that after 5 years this will not continue.

I firmly object to all of the above applications for the following reasons:

The use of these buildings for emergency housing has already had an enormous negative impact on the city of Rotorua, and will take a long time for our reputation to recover as a tourist hotspot. Any further use of these building for emergency housing will further tarnish our once beautiful city's reputation and prolong the discontent and disgust that most Rotorua residents have towards these properties and the activities that go on in them.

This is not the type of accomodation for children and at risk people, the area in question has been the talk of the town for two years and has been assocciated with criminal activity, fighting, verbal/physical abuse, intimidation, burglary, rubbish on the streets, abandoned shoppping trolleys, grafitti and an area that now looks like a "rough" part of town as apposed to the once beautiful and well kept Golden Mile that greeted visitors arriving in Rotorua.

We know from people outside of Rotorua including family and friends who now have concerns and are reluctant to visit Rotorua because of the crime and disorderly behaviour, Particularly around the city and Fenton street. This has had a huge impact on the city, espsecially when people from as far away as Northland and Queenstown are talking negativily about Rotorua.

The influx of people from outside Rotorua to use this emergency housing is widely known, and to my knowledge once they have been here for just 1 month they are deemed Rotorua residents. Council and Government have hoodwinked us into beleiving it is for the betterment of those being housed and for the betterment of employment opportunities, I'd like to see where these are, as some jobs are not of their liking and they prefer to make other lives in this city hell by unrully behaviour, intimidation, asaults, petty crime and burglary. People are leaving Rotorua because of this, my family is also considering this option if the environment in the city doesn't change for the good.

5 years is excessive, its a flat out no. Given that we will need these motels to cater for the visitors from within NZ plus overseas visitors. Council have spent our endless bucket of rates money on building infrastructure to cater for the local and visitor markets. They need specialized help and at the present point in time we just dont have enough programs to cater for the local need without importing a bigger problem.

I am opposed to the granting of resource consent to enable the Ministry of Housing and Urban Development to use the sites and existing buildings of 12 motels in Rotorua for emergency housing for the next 5 years.

The control and management of those in existing emergency housing has clearly been inadequate and this experience gives Rotorua residents no confidence that the proposed 5 year period would lead to improved outcomes and the sense of safety and security that Fenton St, Glenholme residents and ratepayers and Rotorua citizens in general long to return to.

Social difficulties in Rotorua have become widely known throughout NZ and the city has suffered reputationally as a result. This means a significant economic impact on an accommodation and hospitality industry historically worth hundreds of millions to the city.

It may be less well known that many Rotorua citizens will not drive through the city area without car doors locked and stories of residents witnessing unseemly behaviour and abuse of the emergency housing system abound just as reports of criminal activity are now under-reported in our newspaper.

We must return to being a city of higher standards with urgency. A five year transition back to what we remember as normal pre-covid conditions is well short of the requisite priority.



I am opposed to the resource consent process.

One.Only 12 Businesses listed. There are approx 90 Motels in Rotorua with over 50 having MSD clients like the 12 Businesses above.

Two. The time frame of 5 years is too much.

Three.It's been reported a lot that clients are being sent to Rotorua by MSD.It appears the time frame because of this is too short.

Four.Been reported tahr once people from out of Rotorua coming to Rotorua after 30 days are treated as locals.

Five. Need to have a Sinking lid Policy like the Pokies.

Six.Let MSD just process the real Rotorua locals into homes, apartments, flats or pay for Rentals.

Seven. The harm of homeless in Rotorua over the past 2 years is huge. Crime increases break ins, stolen cars ,utes money stolen. Beggars in Streets.

Eight. The lease of the Motel appear to what I call Milking the System. MSD is paying too much for the Motel Rooms. Have been advised over \$1 Million plus per Motel.

Nine. Cheaper to rent Houses than pay motels. Approx \$500 per rental.

Ten.Rotorua has a lot of BnB Rentals in Rotorua due to the tourist attractions.It is far easier and more financial for owners of Houses to have BnBs.

Eleven. Four Canoes Hotel Not mentioned. There is a mental Health issue with a number of MSD guests. Rotorua Hospital only has a certain number of rooms for the Mental Health patients.

Twelve. With increase in Crime More Police are required. At present Police calls take longer to action.

Thirteen.Perhaps it would be cheaper for MSD to purchase a number of Motels outright (Business,Land and Buildings) and turn them into flats. For Single of Married couples no children.

Fourteen.MSD to fund part of Security Personal for Rotorua City.Residents do not feel safe in walking around Rotorua.

Fifteen.Issues with Glenholme. Break ins with many places being broken into a number of times.Reduce this by MSD providing Security Coverage eg Cameras.

Sixteen. Do not put Gang People in Motels near residents. Move Gang people further away from the Residential Area.

Seventeen.With MSD numbers which should decrease over time reduce number of Motels required and have the Motels in the same area.Should be able to monitor the MSD guests better.

Eighteen.Have an 0800 number maned 24/7 so residents feel better connected.May provide coverage for other centres.

Nineteen Be honest with residents. Have regular meetings so residents issues can be mentioned.

Twenty.Have been a past Retailer for over 36 years and I am aware of the damage done by the MDS clients to the accommodation and Tourism Sector.

Twenty One.Many companies are having to spend more money on Security like Countdown with Security tabs and Security Staff based in there businesses. Theft has increased people are desperate.

Twenty Two.MSD should provide more funding for Foodbanks like Linton Park, St Johns Church, Salvation Army. More people are needing food parcels due to the financial times.Many clients MSD guests.

Twenty Three. Work better with Community Groups

Distance. Close to Supermaket Shops and a Garage.

Twenty Four Rotorua can not build the numbers of houses/units which are required.Looks like 300 to 400 houses per year.Cost at present of building a house \$4,000 per square meter.Need to look at 2 level units close together.Garage Laundry,Kitchen,Dinning Room, Lounge Downstairs 2 to 3 bedrooms upstairs with toilet, shower, bath.Need to look at above Brent Road, Primary School, Intermidate School High School all within walking

My submission is:

I totally oppose all parts of the submission for the following reasons:

Motel accommodation is not suitable for families for more than a week or two.

Motel accommodation is not designed for long term residential occupation.

A term of five years would in effect become a long term permanent arrangement.

It would tie up a significant number of Rotorua motels for 5 years from their intended purpose of providing tourist accommodation, thus adversely affecting the Rotorua economy.

It is unacceptable to see the impact that emergency housing has had on the main entrance to Rotorua with the subsequent increase in anti-social behaviour.

The entrance to Rotorua has been degraded especially when you see the number of security fences that have appeared.

Residents in adjoining suburbs are becoming concerned for their safety.

I do not believe these motels should be allowed to operate outside the district plan.

Motel accommodation is not suitable for families for more than a week or two.

Motel accommodation is not designed for long term residential occupation.

A term of five years would in effect become a long term permanent arrangement.

It would tie up a significant number of Rotorua motels for 5 years from their intended purpose of providing tourist accommodation, thus adversely affecting the Rotorua economy.

It is unacceptable to see the impact that emergency housing has had on the main entrance to Rotorua with the subsequent increase in anti-social behaviour.

The entrance to Rotorua has been degraded especially when you see the number of security fences that have appeared.

Submission

Like the majority of Rotorua residents who have either been born here or have moved here, we choose to stay in this amazing city because of the environment, the culture and the amazing variety of activities that we have on our doorstep. To quote a few, we have the lakes, the forests, Maori culture such as Mitai and Tamaki tours, historical culture such as our wonderful Museum, plus Skyline Skyrides, Fairy Springs, Paradise Valley, the Agrodome, Eat Streat etc etc. And these places exist for one reason only, and that is because we are a tourist city. We don't have great industrial parks, we don't have centres of commerce or Government agencies in our city – we have tourism.

Tourists who for decades have loved to stay in accommodation, Hotels and Motels within walking distance of our CBD, in Fenton Street or the surrounding areas. Tourists who spend a lot of money in Rotorua keeping our economy afloat and who want and deserve to feel safe as they walk to and from town.

We own a substantial property on the corner of Peace and Fenton St's. It has a high value and had been rented for several years to a group of young professionals working in the health sector. Our tenants, who loved where they lived, told me that they no longer felt safe in their home. Their vehicles had been interfered with, they were harassed when sitting outside and the property was constantly littered with bottles and rubbish. These tenants moved out of the property in January 2022 because they were frankly frightened of the neighbourhood and sick of putting up with repeated anti-social behaviour. I have attached a signed statement of facts relating to their experience from these tenants.

During the 6 months since these tenants moved, we have carried out renovation work on the property which has meant that for several months we were working there on a daily basis. We worked outside and on the roof for a couple of weeks. Our property is elevated and gives a perfect view of 5 properties which are currently being used for emergency housing. It is directly opposite Ace Motor Lodge and Malones Motel, Rose Court Motel is slightly further away but we still have a perfect view of the goings on. Pure Motel and Guest House is situated on a diagonal to us on the other side of Fenton. We now have first hand experience of what our tenants described to us. At least 4 times per week, every week, the police were in attendance, sometimes several times a day. The seat in front of Pure Motel on Fenton was used as a drinking seat all through the summer months. We saw regular drinking there, starting from 8.30 in the morning, and witnessed bottles being thrown over the fence or onto the street. We have seen arrests being made in all of these premises. Shouting and screaming is a regular occurrence. We witnessed several fights which involved a number of people, one in particular on Fenton St outside Rose Court. This involved on unpatched person being beaten by 3 patched gang members. My husband and our worker actually ran across the road to intervene as there was a serious beating going on. Of note here was that the 'security staff' from Malones stood with their arms folded on the footpath, watching the fight and did nothing to stop it. My husband and our worker eventually were able to push the victim into a Rose Court Motel room where the occupant had been standing screaming for them to stop fighting. The gang members walked off and the victim and a young boy who was with him stayed for a while in the motel room saying that they were too scared to walk back home because the gang members might see them and finish off the beating. Occupants walking up and down the street, or simply sitting around the outside of the buildings are regularly seen to be in some state of intoxication, whether from alcohol or meth is anyone's guess. We have personally witnessed at least 3 very obvious drug deals happening out on the

I have spoken to several police officers regarding incidents in these accommodations. I was told recently by 2 police officers that entering these buildings has now become extremely dangerous for them, as groups of residents have started surrounding police officers in a very intimidating manner, refusing to give information and in no uncertain terms, telling them to leave. In their opinion, it is only a matter of time before this behaviour escalates into something far more aggressive and dangerous

You may think that this is a submission about nimbyism. You would be wrong. We own a few properties in Rotorua, 2 of which have recently been renovated to a very high standard. We have chosen to rent our valuable assets through an agency (Airedale Properties) who has a government contract to try and house good families who would otherwise never be able to get a rental property. These families are now living in good

homes, in good suburbs. Their children are close to good schools and parks, have their own bit of land to play in and are surrounded by good neighbours. They are, probably for the first time in their lives not only safe and comfortable, but more importantly, they are learning how to respect property, to be good neighbours and good tenants, and hopefully will eventually be accepted by other landlords without hesitation. This is how to help the homeless. This is how a community should work together, with the help of government agencies to allow people the dignity of having a home and being a part of good community.

How would you feel, being taken away from your home and whanau, trucked into an unfamiliar city and housed like battery hens in pokey unsuitable motel rooms. Certainly not a great place to bring up children. Any support that you may have had in your home town is gone, you are possibly surrounded by drug dealers or worse, your children exposed to all manner of anti-social behaviour and it won't take long for you to work out that you have become disliked and frowned upon by locals through no fault of your own.

Using our valuable motel stock to house New Zealand's homeless is not only a short sighted decision, but also a massively destructive one. The present owners of these motels will make good money, and move on, substantially richer, without a care in the world. But the risk of ruining Rotorua's reputation as a premier tourist destination, a reputation which has taken decades of time and millions of dollars to grow is worth far more to Rotorua than the financial needs of these moteliers. Our reputation is precious, it is invaluable.

We believe, that of equal importance to the loss of Rotorua's good reputation, is the harm caused to the people involved.

Surely when rehoming individuals and families, the end goal isn't just to supply accommodation. It must also be to locate people to places where they have opportunities to be gainfully employed and live productive lives. As we have previously mentioned, and stress again, Rotorua is primarily a tourist town. Any unskilled work available is most likely to come from the tourism sector, but by destroying that sector, by housing people in the very place where tourists would want to stay, is grossly counterproductive. They deserve better, Rotorua deserves better.

We are pushing back against this negative government initiative. Please do not allow MHUD to use the 12 named Rotorua Motels for contracted emergency housing for a further five years but encourage them to find local solutions in grass roots New Zealand for those needing homes and to simply leave our city alone.

Statement from the tenants of 1 Peace St, Rotorua.

Tweety Cheng - Pharmacist, Rotorua. Tenant since January 2019

Thumb Yang - Oral Health Therapist, Rotorua. Tenant since January 2019.

We, the above tenants of 1 Peace St, Rotorua, state the following.

When we moved into the property in January 2019, we felt very safe in the property, and in the neighbourhood in general. We felt safe because of the type of residential neighbourhood that it was, with a retirement village at the other end of the street, and very quiet respectful neighbours. The majority of people who we saw walking on Fenton St were clearly tourists going to and from town. It is an area very close to the CBD and an easy walk.

We have noticed many dramatic changes to our living environment over the past 3 years.

The feeling of the neighbourhood has changed considerably in that time, especially in regard to people on Fenton St. We now definitely feel very unsafe. The following are some of the incidents and observations made which have made us feel unsafe.

- We have had a bike stolen from the property in December 2020. It was in a
 fenced and locked area so the thief would have had to climb in to get it.
 This is scary because it means that someone was on our property, looking
 over fences into our home.
- We have random kids running around on the property. We tell them to leave, but they come back. They like to run around on top of a stone retaining wall facing Fenton St, its about 10 feet tall and very dangerous.
- 3. We have friends living at Peace St. Both properties have had break ins within the last 4 months. We feel that we would have been broken into but our house is very visible from Fenton St so it would be harder to do so undetected.
- 4. We regularly hear shouting, screaming and glass breaking from across the road in Ace Motel housing who I believe are people who were homeless.
- 5. There are many random and undesirable people walking about at all hours of the night time. They usually appear to be drunk or on drugs. Their behaviour is very anti-social and threatening to us. All of our cars are parked on the driveway or on the grass verge. They are often tampered with as in the alarms are set off.

- 6. We are constantly having to pick up bottles, nappies and other rubbish from around the property. This never happened when we first moved in.
- 7. We no longer walk to town to do our shopping or sit outside of our fenced area. We have been verbally abused and harassed too many times.
- 8. We have a friend who works and lives-in at She likes to visit us in the evening. She is very afraid to walk home on her own now because of these people who are on the streets.
- 9. We see police arriving on the side streets and going to various motels all the time.
- 10.We see and hear motor bikes coming and going in and out of the motels regularly. They arrive and leave very quickly. We have been told that this is often how drug suppliers deliver to their dealers.
- 11. Guys are always racing their cars up and down the street. They do a lot of burn outs too right on Fenton St. It is so bad that we cant leave out windows open because of the burnt rubber smell coming off these cars.

12. We do not feel very safe here now at all.

NB Without knowing the suitability and what each of the above facilities offer I cannot comment on suitability for such a purpose.

However I make the following comments.

I agree that some transitional accommodation is required for residents (people who live in Rotorua and/or have their primary whanau/family connections in the Rotorua district.)

Such accommodation should not be shared accommodation with visitors or tourists and located in areas which do not impact on Rotorua's image as a destination of choice for visitors and tourists.

Also such accommodation should not impact on current residents in such a way they feel unsafe/uncomfortable going about their daily life in their neighbourhoods.

Accommodation offered should not place families in situations of over crowding and lack of personal space as this will just lead to additional stress to already difficult circumstances that people seeking transitional housing are experiencing.

Removal of this number of accommodation facilities also limits the accommodation available for other purposes. It has also become widely known across the country that Rotorua is becoming a Hub for transitional housing and people are staying elsewhere and travelling to Rotorua for day trips.

As stated earlier I am not opposed to transitional housing as such. It just needs to be located appropriately, be suitable to not increase stress to families/individuals and restricted to people from the Rotorua district or those whose primary whanau/family/hapu already live here and can provide support.

Some personal stuff.

I frequently stay out of town and meet a lot travellers. Some of the comments have been about Rotorua no longer having the appeal it once had. One comment comes to mind. "Its getting a run down feel to it and what has happened to Fenton street?...... we prefer as a family to stay in Taupo now and do day trips up there."

I catch the the bus from time to time on Fenton Street opposite Pak'nSave. Over the last couple of years on a number of occasions people gather there, some under the influence of substances and openly "trade" cigarettes and alcohol. It is not pleasant at times.

I was visiting a friend and asked, was the local school doing some renovations as it was all fenced off. The reply was it was to keep the children safe as residents of close by motels were coming into the school grounds and using them as a thorougfare.

General Comments.

The suitability of motels is questionable for transitional housing due to the room size and limited appliance facilities most have. Placing families in such environments in my view just increases the challenges they face.

In addition having people placed away from their social networks, familiar services, schools and doctors etc does not enhance overall well being of a family.

There appears to be an interesting industry being established around the services to assist transitional housing and once an infrastructure like this is established there will be an ongoing demand that will be difficult to unwind. Another five years on two plus already would suggest this will become part of Kainga Ora's solution to supported housing.

Once NZ boarders are fully open and the labour shortage addressed the pressure to house tens of thousands more people will come on stream to place more pressure on general accommodation availability.

I believe in considering this Consent request the Applicant needs to be able to show what will happen at the end of the application period.

I oppose all of the above applications for the following reasons:

1. The look of Fenton Street is disgusting now, an embarrassment to the city. There are temporary fences up, guards at gates, messy yards, shopping trolleys, rubbish, empty beer/alcohol bottles, dodgy/damaged cars (e.g. broken windows, dented, etc) parked all over the verge, shouting, gang signia. 2. I have been running for approximately 5 years now, and would run on Fenton Street 2-3 times a week. However,

I no longer feel safe running alone, especially as a female. I am very wary about where I run, especially at night time. I try to stick to main roads and roads with better lighting. My husband doesn't like me running on my own now, but we have a tracking app on our phones, so I now give him a plan of where I am running and he often monitors it while I am out. I cannot remember the last time I went out for a run and did not see a police car on or around Fenton Street.

3. We got a puppy in January 2022 and I avoid walking her on Fenton Street due to the dogs living in the motels. I have heard numerous stories of people's dogs being attacked by dogs living in the motels, and my own father has had a few close calls with his own dog.

4. We walk often as a family, and our typical walk is around Rotorua Golf Course, walking along Fenton Street from the Hemo Gorge roundabout down to Robertson Street. The kids either walk, scoot, or bike. We have had numerous close calls with cars coming out of motel driveways, as a biproduct of having so many people, and therefore vehicles, permanently at the motels. Whilst we have always been wary of the motel driveways, they are noticeably busier since the motels have been used as permanent housing.

5. We no longer feel safe in our home as a family. We never used to lock the doors at night, and often left our front ranch slider door open during the summer months. However, now we make sure all doors and cars are locked. My children ask why we always hear police sirens every night now. We have lived at this address for over 12 years.

6. When not at home, we lock our puppy up inside the house, as I am scared that she will be taken otherwise. We have previously owned two dogs at this same address and never worried about that before.

7. As a mother, I feel horrified that families are having to live in motel rooms. We are a family of 6, living in a 4 bedroom, 1 living area house, and we are often tripping over each other. I think it is terrible that we are expecting families to live in these tiny spaces for extended/indefinite periods of time. There is no proper play area for the children, and it must be near impossible for children to go to sleep at an appropriately early hour as adults must be awake in the same area as they are trying to sleep. 8. The presence of gangs has noticeably increased in the city. Gang colours and insignia are quite prominent, and it is common to come across gangs hurling abuse at each other. My children have started to ask questions about gangs and what they do and who they are and why they are fighting, etc. This was something that they were oblivious to a couple of years ago.

9. I am also concerned that we are putting vulnerable people - both adults and children - in situations where they are constantly exposed to gangs, durgs, alcohol, abuse - all of which can become seemingly normal with repetitive exposure. And which they may become involved in/addicted to.

10. Tourists are no longer wanting to come to Rotorua. There is nowhere for them to stay. Or, if they do stay somewhere along Fenton St, they are having unpleasant experiences due to the current residents in the motels. Tourists not visiting Rotorua has a direct impact on the economy of our city. And is a reputation that could scar our city for years.

11. It is frustrating that there are homeless people coming to Rotorua from out of town. It also appears that a lot of these people are abusing the system, and have places where they could be living, but are making the most of accessing the free accommodation and utilities that go with living in a motel. I have heard stories of people living in motels for a year or so, and then saying that they have had enough so they are going home. At Christmas time, the motels were basically empty as everyone "went home" for the holidays. It also seems illogical to me that people who are being put into motels for "emergency accommodation" do not necessarily have an application in for "emergency housing". If we are not catering for those in emergency situations, then who are using the motels? And if their situation is not an "emergency", then how long are they going to choose to stay living in the motels. And if there is no criteria around who is staying in the motels, then how many people, and for how long, will they be staying in motels?

12. Due to the current situation, with so many "homeless" people living in "emergency housing" in our local motels, and the resulting increase in crime and antisocial behaviour associated with this, my sister and her family have moved to a different city, my parents have considereed moving with them, and our friends are currently looking at relocating out of the Glenholme area, possibly out of town completely as well. In trying to help a small number of people, increasing the number of motels being used is actually just creating a bigger issue, and is negatively impacting the lives of people already living in Rotorua, and in some situations like my own, ripping families apart.
