Fluoridation is always a controversial and often emotive topic and I have always believed decisions about fluoridating or not should sit with health authorities that are responsible for public health, rather than leaving it to local authorities. In Rotorua successive Councils have been unable to reach a consensus and the voting has always gone against fluoridation. We last debate it in 2014 when voting ultimately went against holding a community referendum. I acknowledge some in our community will be unhappy about this but as a former health professional and a former associate minister of health, I personally support fluoridation as a public health initiative and think it's long overdue. I'll be interested to see what impact this has on the oral health of our community over time — it will take some years for us to see that.

I hope you are managing to keep fit and well and only suffering mild Covid or the Flu.

I note in the Daily Post that the Council acting infrastructure and environmental solutions deputy chief executive Regan Fraser said the council would consider the information provided and look at the necessary steps it needed to take to implement the directive. It would include drinking water treatment plant upgrades for the central and eastern supplies.

You may like to inform this person that at the Central Water supply springs there is already the building infrastructure in place and that all that is required is the Mechanical Plant to inject the solution. This solution should be up and running prior to Xmas 2022 at the very latest.

Regarding the Eastern supply, I understand that the existing spring water already contains a degree of natural fluorine, so installing a treatment plant at the Eastern springs again should not be very onerous. A little bit of history for you, Fluoridation of the Central Supply was undertaken in the early 1980's after receiving a Government Subsidy, but due to a minority of ratepayers complaining the Council of the day decreed that it should cease. The mechanical equipment was uninstalled and sold to Taupo District Council mid 1980's with the Ministry of Health's blessing.



diktats from the Ministry of Health. Bloomfield's parting shot as he left the Ministry of Health last not completed, or indeed appears to have even undertaken, any of the legislative requirements. Another OIA has been sent to see exactly what legislative requirements were completed before week, was to order 14 councils to start fluoridation or else. This is despite Information received under the Official Information Act showing that (as at the 5th of July) the Director General had Councils face hundreds of thousands of dollars in fines if they do not comply with the latest the directives were sent. So far the community of Waipa is voicing opposition (see below). We need people in each of the minded people is a good start. Then speaking at your local council will get the ball rolling. If you need help to get started, please contact us. We need the councils to fight back in the same way 14 councils to start a local campaign. Going to local Freedom group meetings to find likesome of the councils are fighting back against Three Waters.

The Councils were:

Auckland (Onehunga and Hui Village), Hastings, Horowhenua (Levin), Kawerau, Nelson, New Plymouth, Rotorua Lakes, Tararua, Tauranga City, Waipa (Cambridge), Waitaki (Oamaru), Western Bay of Plenty, Far North (Kerikeri and Kaitaia) and Whangārei councils will have between six months and over three years, depending on the circumstances, to fluoridate parts of their water supply that were not already fluoridated.

The councils have been given between one and three years to get fluoridation up and running. Under the Health Act, councils would be liable for a fine of up to \$200,000 plus \$10,000 for every DAY the order is not complied with.





Dear Mayor and Councillors

I am aware that the Director General of Health (DG) has recently sent a Directive to our council to start fluoridation. This is against the wishes of many people in this community. Please stand up for our community as you have been elected to do.

- Fluoride is now well established as a neurotoxic even at the levels present in fluoridated water.
- The legislation that enables the DG to direct councils does not require the DG to consider any potential adverse health effects.
- Fluoridation chemicals are scrubbed from the chimneys of the phosphate fertilizer industry and contain traces of lead, arsenic, mercury and sometimes even uranium
- Most countries in the world, including 97% of Europe, do NOT fluoridate their water supply
- In 2018 the New Zealand Supreme Court ruled that "fluoridation is compulsory medical treatment"
- The research the DG cites in making his decision does not support his claims:
 - o The <u>Cochrane Review of 2015</u> found most studies had been carried out before 1975 and may not be relevant today with the widespread use of fluoridated toothpaste
 - o The <u>Sapere Report</u> uses data from 2008, which is out of date and had too little data to make any firm conclusions
 - o The <u>New Zealand School Dental Statistics</u> show there is no discernible difference in decay rates between fluoridated and non-fluoridated areas.
